Networks

Relaunching the NZPSA Political Communication Network

University of Waikato, Tauranga, 26-27 November 2020

Please join us for a two-day workshop to mark the relaunch of the NZPSA Political Communication Network. From public health briefings to viral conspiracy theories, the ongoing Coronavirus crisis – if nothing else - reaffirms the importance of political communication. To improve our understanding of the practices, content, and implications of political communication, the relaunched Network provides a vital scholarly forum for the exchange of ideas and findings.

At our first workshop, we aim to take stock of political communication research by scholars based in Aotearoa New Zealand. We therefore invite paper proposals from a diverse range of theoretical and methodological perspectives. We also recognise that scholars study political communication across a wide range of actors, including – but not limited to – political parties, news media, governmental institutions, international organisations, interest groups, social movements, and digital citizens.

Postgraduate research students are particularly encouraged to participate.

Creative writing, ideally not more than 800 words, but this is flexible

5th International Conference on Public Policy – Call for Panels

Following the success of the four previous International Conferences on Public Policy in Grenoble (2013), Milan (2015), Singapore (2017) and Montreal (2019), we are happy to announce the opening of the call for panels for the fifth International Conference on Public Policy (ICPP5), the leading international conference for public policy scholarship. Jointly organized with the Institut Barcelona d'Estudis Internacionals (IBEI), ICPP5 will take place at the Raval Building of the University of Barcelona from June 30 to July 2, 2021, with the pre-conference at IBEI's headquarters on June 29.

The Call for Panels for the ICPP5 is currently open until October 26, 2020. Scholars are invited to submit a panel proposal to participate in ICPP5. The panels can address any theoretical, methodological, or empirical research question and cover a large range of topics provided they are related to Public Policy.

Upcoming Events

Two webinars are being organised by Assoc. Professor Rachel Simon-Kumar (University of Auckland) and Prof. Priya Kurian (University of Waikato) as part of their Marsden-funded research, entitled "Ethnic women in politics: Meet the candidates" on 29 & 30 September (TBC), 6-7.30 pm. The two panels, one involving young ethnic women running for Parliament for the first time, and the second involving established ethnic women politicians, will explore questions about issues of identity and politics, aspirations and challenges, and the impact that ethnic women's presence in politics has on ethnic women in the community. Stop Sexual Harassment on Campus Aotearoa (SSHOC Aotearoa)

SSHOC Aotearoa is a newly formed, pan-University collective of staff and students, launched on 21 August 2020. It is aimed at 'preventing bullying, discrimination and sexual violence on University campuses.' SSHOC has called on Universities NZ to set up an independent commission to investigate complaints of harassment and assault, as well as collect information that would prevent predatory staff from moving on without checks or penalties.

The NZPSA supports SSHOC's broad aims of developing more effective standards, monitoring, and independent oversight of the investigation of complaints of bullying, harassment and assault. In light of the on-going national and international conversations on sexual harassment and assault, we support developing an Anti-Sexual Harassment Policy to govern NZPSA national and network conferences and symposia.
