The organisers encourage paper abstracts (150-200 words) or panel proposals (of up to five papers) that speak to the diverse approaches, issues and methods in the study of politics. The theme of the conference is *Conflict and Discord: Politics in a Time of Crisis*.

\$2,000 Grant

At the 2013 AGM it was decided that we would establish a bi-annual grant of up to \$2,000 for a project that will benefit a NZPSA collective such as a Network, the Women's Caucus, the Postgraduate Body or another significant part of the membership.

The sorts of projects we might fund include postgraduate conferences or writing retreats, a keynote speaker for the NZPSA Conference, other specialist workshops leading to a significant publication, a NZ election event, or other events on key political issues etc.

The project should benefit a group of people (not just an individual) across institutions, thus offering benefit to the wider NZPSA community.

New Networks can be formed for the purpose of applying for funding by gathering ten NZPSA members together and contacting the Executive.

NZPSA collectives, their representatives and/or individual members are therefore invited to submit applications for project funding by **5pm 30 June 2014** to the President of the NZPSA who will establish a committee to assess them.
