# NZPSA Annual conference 2021: Auckland University of Technology (AUT), City Campus *The Politics of Crisis*

The annual conference of the New Zealand Political Studies Association will be held at AUT from Monday 29<sup>th</sup> November until Wednesday 1<sup>st</sup> December 2021. After a prolonged period of online interactions, we look forward to seeing everyone in person! We welcome paper submissions, especially those that relate to our theme of *The Politics of Crisis*.

For a single author paper include: your name and institutional affiliation (if applicable), paper title, and a 150-250 word abstract. For a paper with multiple authors include: the names, institutional affiliations and email addresses of all authors of the paper, the name of the conference presenter(s), the paper title and a 150-250 word abstract.

For panel session and roundtable proposals: please ensure the commitment of all presenters to attend the conference before submitting your proposal. Include information, as above, for all authors and presenters. Abstracts must be submitted for a paper to be included in a panel session. Indicate the unifying theme of the session and where else in the conference the paper proposals might be placed should the panel session or roundtable not proceed for any reason.

The journal receives academic papers and bibliographic reviews in Spanish, English, French, Portuguese, and Italian.
