Representation & Responsibility – The 2018 NZPSA Conference at Victoria University of Wellington

The Victoria University of Wellington Political Science & International Relations Programme is pleased to be hosting the 2018 NZPSA Conference. The conference will be held on the 26th-28th of November with a postgraduate workshop on the 25th of November. The theme of this year's conference is Representation and Responsibility. The conference features public events to explore the theme – these are to be announced – in addition to the usual topic streams.

We encourage conference participants to reflect on the interplay of representation and responsibility in politics, including (but not exclusively) questions such as: what forms of representation promote the interests and values of disadvantaged groups? How do current patterns of representation affect important socio-economic and political outcomes? How do we distribute responsibility for solving local and global problems? What kinds of responsibilities do political leaders and citizens have for these problems? How do we keep our representatives and rulers accountable?

The XIII Annual Conference of the IRSPM is being hosted by the School of Government at Victoria University of Wellington's Pipitea Campus. The conference theme for 2019 is 'ReNewing Public Management for Stewardship, Innovation and Impact'. IRSPM uses a two-stage process in compiling the conference programme. This first stage is for panel proposals. In the second stage, successful panel chairs will then be invited to circulate a 'call for papers' for their panel. 1st IPPA Early Researcher Award

The International Public Policy Association (IPPA) Early Researcher Award is awarded biennially to a scholar who, within seven years of completing the PhD, has published a single-authored monograph that represents a major theoretical, methodological and/or contribution to the field of Public Policy and/or Public Administration. The deadline for the submission of nominations is the 1st of September 2018, with the announcement of the award occurring in January 2019. The award will be officially presented at ICPP4-Montreal 2019, where the winner will appear on a panel devoted his/her book. NZPSA Annual Prizes

The NZPSA is pleased to announce that applications are now open for the five NZPSA Annual Prizes. These are:

• Undergraduate Essay Prize in Māori Politics

This prize in Māori Politics initiated in 2015 is funded jointly to begin with by the NZPSA and the royalties from New Zealand Government and Politics (OUP) due to the generosity of Janine Hayward and Raymond Miller as the book's current and past editors. As those royalties increase, Janine and Raymond have kindly agreed to take over full financial responsibility for the prize.

Undergraduate Essay Prize for Aotearoa New Zealand Politics

This prize originated in 2009 due to the generosity of Raymond Miller and from 2015 it will continue due to Janine Hayward's generosity as the new editor of *New Zealand Government and Politics* (Oxford University Press). It is funded from the book's royalties.

• NZ Politics Postgraduate Conference Paper Prize

This prize originated in 2009 due to the generosity of Raymond Miller and from 2015 it will continue due to Janine Hayward's generosity as the new editor of *New Zealand Government and Politics* (Oxford University Press). It is funded from the book's royalties. A prize of \$500 is awarded each year for the best postgraduate paper at the NZPSA conference in the field of New Zealand domestic politics.

• NZPSA Postgraduate Conference Paper Prize

Since 2007 a prize of \$500 has been awarded for the best postgraduate paper at the NZPSA conference, and from 2009 it has been awarded to a paper in any area of political studies other than Aotearoa New Zealand domestic politics.

Environmental Politics and Policy Postgraduate Conference Paper Prize

In 2016 a new prize of \$500 was launched for postgraduates in the field of environmental politics and policy for a paper presented at the NZPSA conference. The aim of the prize is to stimulate and recognize the work of excellent postgraduate researchers working on issues of environmental policy, political ecology, environmental governance and justice.

All prize winners are announced at the Annual Dinner at the NZPSA Conference in December and are recorded on the NZPSA website. Please publicise these awards widely.
