Celebrating 2024 as the 50th Anniversary of the NZPSA, our themes for this edition in 2025 encourage both looking back at the past 50 years, and looking forward to an inclusive and diverse Aotearoa. We are particularly interested in papers on what being cis women, trans women, and non-binary persons researching politics, participating in politics, and constructing politics has meant and will mean.

But within and without those themes we also will consider all pieces written by women, transand non-binary persons who are working with a gender lens. - Original research papers: 2,000-5,000 words
- Commentary: 500-2,500 words
- Summary of published articles: 800 words
- Reports of dissertations: No more than 2,000 words
- Research abstracts: 200-300 words
- Creative work (plays, poems, pictures, or stories): up to 5,000 words
